Auction

Invite people to donate various items such as concert tickets, sports or music memorabilia, a car wash, or a night out.

Then organise a fun evening with drinks, snacks and music and auction your items off to the highest bidder.





Bake a cake

Everyone loves baking. Ask all those top bakers you know to prepare a selection of goodies and invite people together to enjoy them. You could sell the cakes individually for take away or charge an entry ticket and make it a help yourself.

Why not try baking our favourite Basbousa cake which is enjoyed by our brothers and sisters in Egypt.





Christmas market

Christmas markets are a great way for churches to engage with their local community. Decorate your building, serve hot chocolate, organise some carollers, sell Christmas crafts, food, art, and whatever else you can make and collect.





Dinner party

Prepare a top quality 3-course meal for some friends and ask them to make a contribution based on how much they would normally pay for a restaurant meal. You could get together with a group of friends and each take a turn to cook. You could even get competitive with scores for the best food.





Esther experience

Film night

Organise a film night in your home or church. Set a ticket donation price and prepare snacks and drinks. Games night

Get your board game enthusiast friends round for a night of fun competition. Set a donation price to compete, decide on a prize, choose the game and see who the winner will be. You could even turn it into a tournament with multiple games over multiple nights.

Food is an important part of fellowship and tasting national dishes can offer a window of experience into some of the countries where Christians experience persecution. It could be plov from Central Asia, kim chi from Korea or chicken curry from Pakistan. Research some recipes and get cooking. Ask your guests to make a donation and as they enjoy the different tastes you can introduce them to the stories of our persecuted brothers and sisters.





Jewellery making

Get crafty. You could buy a simple jewellery-making pack or repurpose old jewellery to create some interesting new designs. You could sell them to family and friends or at a church or local community fare.







Knitting

Are you a knitter? Whether it's scarves, hats, jumpers, or something more decorative, why not use your skills to raise some funds?





Live stream class

What valuable skills do you have that you could share with others on Facebook, etc? Whether it's cooking, crafts or fitness, you could set up an online class to share your knowledge and techniques. Ask people to make a donation when they register and explain what motivated you to fundraise.







Music night

Maybe you're a talented musician or an eager roadie. You could organise a concert, an acoustic night or even a battle of the bands. Sell tickets and take the opportunity to profile Release International's work during the show.





No treats

What could you go without for a week or a month? Coffee, chocolate, dinner out? Whatever it is, you could donate the money you save. You could encourage some friends to join in for mutual support and multiply your fundraising efforts.





Open house

Are you a good host? You could have an open house day where you invite your friends to drop by for coffee, cakes and a catch up. Pick a summer's day and extend it to your garden. You could ask for donations and give your guests a *Voice* magazine to take away.





Photo calendar

Personalised photo calendars are very popular. You could use your own photos of people, landmarks, or scenery, or you could create a church calendar with images of your various activities taken throughout the year. Sell the calendars and donate the proceeds.
